Who is eligible?

Any public or charter school **PreK through 8th grade** Teacher (including special area teachers: art, music, PE, guidance, media, ESE, etc.) in Polk or Hardee County that has developed and successfully implemented an innovative program that improved student academic achievement with a focus on literacy, STEM education, or low performing students.

Teachers may submit one application per funding cycle. Team members may not participate on more than one developer grant application per grant cycle.

Teachers may only receive two Developer Grants in a five year period. (Check <https://polkschoolsfl.com/pef/ideacatalogs/> to verify)

What is the criterion?

- The program must have been fully implemented for at least one year prior to applying.
- The program must align with district wide curriculum (Florida Standards/Sunshine State Standards depending on content area), District Technology Plan, and/or Code of Conduct.
- Information in your application should indicate how the program increased academic achievement related to one or more of the following focus areas: Literacy, STEM education, or Supporting Low Performing Students.
- The program goals must be well defined.
- The materials list should total as close to \$400 as possible.
- The program should be easily adaptable for other schools during the second semester.
- The program should detail the traits that make it both innovative and successful.
- The program **should not duplicate a previously funded Developer Grant**. (Previously funded programs are summarized and available at <https://polkschoolsfl.com/pef/ideacatalogs/>)
